5. *Since they didn't make their complaint out loud, why do you think Jesus addressed it?*
  
6. *What should Jesus' ability to heal have proven to the religious leaders? Matthew 9:5-6*
  
7. *Where is Jesus in Matthew 9:9-13 (see also Luke 5:29), and how do the religious leaders (Pharisees) respond to this? What does Jesus say is His reason for being there?*
  
8. *Explain what you think Jesus meant when He quoted Hosea 6:6 in response to the Pharisees (vs. 13). See also Isaiah 1:11-17 and Micah 6:6-8. How do you apply this to your life?*

12. *Why do you think Jesus asked the blind men the question in vs. 28?*

13. *How did Jesus feel about the crowds following Him? What did He tell His disciples to do about the needs they saw?*
