# The Parable of the Sower

### What are Parables?

The parable was the preferred teaching mechanism of a rabbi.
☐ Rabbis often used parables as sermon
☐ The basic idea of a parable is that it "refers to a simple account used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels."- Bible Hub
"Many scholars argue that Jesus' parables fit the range of forms referred to by the Hebrew term '', which is sometimes translated parable."
Cultural Backgrounds Study Bible  — of Jesus' teachings are parables.
Why Parables?
1. Parables involve everyday situations, making them accessible to a wide audience while also containing deeper meanings for those willing to seek them.
2. The usage of parables often challenged listeners to critically and reflect on their own lives and beliefs.
3. Stories are so powerful that the science behind storytelling is a thing called neural, when someone listens to a story, the neurons in their brain fire in the same pattern as the speaker's brain.
4. Parable form helps us remember.

Parable of the Sower
A. The seed is dispensed to four different types of soil.

C. The parable of the Sower emphasizes the importance of a heart.
Four types of soil:

- The wayside hearer the hard heart or calloused heart
- The shallow hearer- a very thin layer of soil over a limestone rock

- The worldly hearer- a divided heart who is concerned with the cares of this world, the deceitfulness of riches, pleasures and lust of other things. Mark 4:19, Luke 8:14
- The fruitful hearer-James 1:21 speaks of the one who "in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls." (John Bunyan story)
